Scholarship: Offered by the Pell City Education Association (Local Chapter of AEA)

Description: The scholarship fund program will administer this higher education scholarship to be awarded for recognition to a worthy student from Pell City High School.

Field of Specialization: One scholarship will be awarded to a major in any field. This is a one year, nonrenewable scholarship.

Value: The scholarship winner will be awarded \$500.00 for college expenses. The scholarship will be presented to the winner at Pell City High School Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility:

1. Must be a senior who has completed the last two years at Pell City High School.
2. Must be accepted as a student in an accredited college or university.
3. Must have taken one of the standard college entrance exams (ACT or SAT).
4. Must be enrolling as a full-time student in a college or university for the purpose of attaining a degree.

Basis of Award: Point system based on the following:

1. Scholastic Record
2. Character
3. Leadership
4. Citizenship
5. ACT/SAT test scores

Application Procedure:

1. Obtain application from school counselor.
2. Fill out the form completely, correctly, and neatly.
3. Make sure all six separate attachments are included when you turn it in to your counselor no later than April 13, 2018. LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED!
